

#### BAPTISM:

**The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month.** Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated **during** the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

#### DEVOTIONS:

**May:** Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

**October:** Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

**Lent:** Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Źale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

Palms will be available for your taking at next Sunday's Masses. Palms will be found on a table at the back of the church. As we are still following guidelines imposed due to the Covid pandemic, we ask that you simply take **only the palms you touch. Please do not touch palms that you do not intend to take.** There is no need to take time selecting palms; all of them have been blessed. Please maintain social distance while at the table. Also, make certain that your face mask is covering **both** your nose and mouth. Thank you for your cooperation.





**Almost there.** If we consider the season of Lent to be a journey, we can think of each of the forty days as one on which we progress toward a final destination, each as a day on which we take steps to move closer to a point we wish to reach. Just as runners might keep a daily log in which they enter the miles they jog, some Lenten pilgrims might have kept a Lenten journal in which to chart their daily spiritual course. At this point, there are more Lenten days behind us than in front of us.

**Almost there.** A traveler on a long journey might come to a point when it is advisable to stop and take inventory. Is there enough money to get home? Is there enough time and energy to see and do all that was planned? Has this trip been satisfying and enriching thus far? As a Lenten pilgrim, now is the time to stop and check your spiritual compass. Ask yourself, “Up to this point, have I been going in the right direction? Has my compass been pointed to the Cross of salvation? Have my steps taken me forward in my faith? Have I prayed more, fasted regularly, given more?

**Yes, almost there... but not there yet.** There is still time to fulfill the Lenten commitments that you made on Ash Wednesday. There is still time for prayers to be said, alms to be given, sacrifices to be made. Dear pilgrim, “Let not your heart be troubled.” You may remember the lyrics of an old song that bids you to, “Pick yourself up, dust yourself off, and start all over again.” Now is the time. True, for some the Lenten journey may be a shorter one, but it need not be less worthwhile. You may have more ground to cover, but it will be holy ground. **Godspeed.**

or Holy Saturday.




