

BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated during the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday

at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.



How gratifying it was to see 👞 the increase in our church attendance throughout the Easter Triduum! Having lived through last year's Lenten and Easter due to the pandemic, we were so happy to open the doors to our beautiful church again.

As a longtime parishioner of Saint Ladislaus Church, I recognize many, but not all, of the faces that I see in the pews. Some are visitors who come here infrequently, others are newcomers. I am aware that some of our regular worshippers have never been formally registered.

Registration at your church is vitally important. Often people come to our office requesting a sponsorship document that is required in order to serve as a Godparent at a Baptism or a sponsor at a Confirmation. It is simple to obtain and prepare this document if you are registered as a parishioner.

Registration forms are available in the office and can be filled in by a family member during our open office hours. The process takes minutes! When you register, you will begin to receive monthly collection envelopes. Regular use of these envelopes shows that you are an *active parishioner*. We are not asking that you donate a certain amount; rather, we are simply requesting that you use the church envelopes for any amount that you give. Your donations show that you support the church. If you presently receive envelopes, you are already registered; if you do not, please register.
