

Preparing for Our Lenten Journey

If we consider a season that involves much preparation, our minds automatically drift to Christmas. Such a beautiful holiday requires us to make plans well in advance. We write to-do lists enumerating activities that we as hosts or guests must fulfill. We plan menus and select seasonal decorations and music to enhance our merriment. We devote considerable time to planning and celebrating a religious holiday that is very holy and also rich in tradition.

We have just begun Lent, which is the holiest season of the church year. It thus follows that we should make preparations for how we will "live Lent." As Lenten pilgrims, we plan to take steps with Jesus as we embark on a personal spiritual journey. How much we derive from this religious experience depends on how much of ourselves we are willing to invest in this most rewarding spiritual renewal.

How can we make this forty-day season one to remember, one with Lenten practices that will form a spiritual tradition and leave an indelible mark on our spiritual life? We can start in our homes, not by adorning, but rather by creating a simple space that will remind us of Jesus' time in the desert. By placing a piece of purple fabric, a simple wooden cross, a nail (not in a home with young children), and perhaps a small bowl of sand on a table, you have established a daily reminder of the season. You will be prompted to utter a prayer each time you walk by this spot.

For this journey, we won't need much baggage; rather, we will try to lessen our earthly burdens as we accompany Jesus. We rid ourselves of every useless anxiety that weighs us down; therefore, we worry less, we pray more. We complain less, we give thanks more often. We talk about others less, we talk to God more. We think less of what others say about us, we think more about pleasing the Lord. We eat less, we receive the Bread of Life more frequently.

This Lent, we give up more of our 'old selves'; however, our 'new selves' will be far richer in grace. May we remain steadfast on our journey.
