Living my faith...Ash Wednesday

Many people are remarking that this year Ash Wednesday lands on Valentine's Day. True, it is rare that the first day of Lent falls on a day on which many indulge in fancy meals and chocolate treats. Let's consider this in a different light. What better

opportunity to jumpstart our Lenten effort to sacrifice than by giving up the rich fare usually associated with Valentine's Day? We might be tempted by the fancy heart-shaped red satin boxes that are in every store we enter, but are they really symbolic of the love we have for another? Perhaps you will think of other ways to show your love. Pray the rosary for your loved one. Write a beautiful note in your own words. Share a simple meal over which you discuss treasured memories of your life together. Begin your meal with prayerful petitions for those you love. At the end of the meal, your stomach may not be as full as you would like, but your heart will be filled with gratitude for the loved ones whom God has put in your life. After all, true love is not based on the food you eat or the money you spend on a gift. Genuine love for another always involves some sacrifice on your part...a sacrifice of time, effort, of self. Our Lord's great sacrifice for us should prompt us to acts of self-denial and sacrifice. Let's embrace this Ash Wednesday as a day on which we turn away from the usual commercial practices associated with February 14th and take this first important step on our 2018 Lenten journey. jac
