

Although the celebration of motherhood goes back to ancient Greek and Roman times, our 'modern' idea of Mother's Day came in the 20th century. In 1914 President Woodrow Wilson established the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. The actual idea for such a holiday had been conceived earlier by... a mother! Anna Jarvis proposed the idea of celebrating all mothers and their many contributions to society. Mrs. Jarvis chose the carnation as the flower to be associated with Mother's Day. Why? The petals never fall from dying carnations; they cling to the flower just as children cling to their mothers. *Did you know? White carnations are meant for deceased mothers, while pink and red carnations are deemed appropriate for living mothers.*
