Reflection.....the blessing of work

Last Monday we celebrated Labor Day. However you spent the holiday, perhaps a few moments were spent in quiet thought as you gave thanks for the *gift of labor*. It is labor that enables us to use our talents for the good of others. Some jobs appear to be easy and others quite demanding; no matter how simple or difficult the job may be, *someone always benefits from your work*. Take a moment to think of the job that you perform; do you recognize that your job and how you carry it out is in some way helping others? Did you ever stop to think that the people whom you serve in your occupation, be they students, patients, clients, or customers, benefit not only from the service you provide, but also from the smile, the kind word, the patience, and insight that you have graciously included in your own job description?
