unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.*


Reflection. Do I behave joyfully as one who has been

A Steward Saint...Saint Andrew, Apostle

Before Andrew became a disciple of Jesus, he worked
as a fisherman. Such an occupation, one which provides
food for sustenance, is directly linked to a hallmark of
stewardship: feeding the hungry. It is no surprise that
we encounter Andrew in the Gospel story of the feeding
of the multitude. It was he who indicated to Jesus that
there was a boy in their midst who had five loaves of
bread and two fish. This fact tells us something about
this disciple; he recognized a potential problem and
sought to help solve it. Jesus was grateful for the
seemingly small contribution of the boy's few food
items and used them to feed many. This meaningful
story of stewardship at work illustrates the fact that
even gifts that are small may have enormous benefits.
