#### **BAPTISM:**

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends. Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). *(Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

following the 9:30 AM Polish Mass.



Living our faith....The Sign of the Cross

Let us consider how many times in a week that we bless ourselves. Each time we do so, we are honoring the Holy Trinity. The Sign of the Cross identifies us as Catholics. By blessing ourselves, we acknowledge our faith.

Because we begin and end our prayer by signing ourselves, we may consider the Sign of the Cross to be an *introduction* to prayer; rather, **the Sign of the Cross is a prayer in itself.** That being said, it follows that we say this prayer slowly and thoughtfully, not hurriedly. By carefully and deliberately signing ourselves, we remind ourselves that, for the moment, we are closing the door on the temporal world and are prepared to give God our full attention. Making the Sign of the Cross is an affirmation of our belief in the Holy Trinity, an acknowledgment of our discipleship.

Today, as we focus on the Most Holy Trinity, let us commit to offering this simple and beautiful prayer as a priest did at our Baptism...thoughtfully and reverently.

**Reflection:** When I pray the sign of the Cross, am I reminded of the magnitude of my being a Baptized person, one of a faith community that shares a belief in the Trinity?
