BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the **month.** Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated during the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.



November 11: An Important Date in Polish History

100 years ago, after 123 years of occupation, Poland reclaimed its rightful place as a free and independent member of the community of nations. On November 11, 1918, Polish leaders such as Jozef Pitsudski, Roman Dmowski, Ignacy Jan Paderewski, Wincenty Witos, Wojciech Korfanty, and Ignacy Daszynski, of differing backgrounds and political opinions, united to lead Poland to freedom, just as General Casimir Pulaski did in the war for American independence.

The reconstruction of the Polish state after 123 years of partitions was a historic breakthrough. The effort of many Poles, their commitment and sacrifice during the First World War, along with vigorous diplomatic actions, resulted in the creation of the Second Republic of Poland. The whole process was led by the "Fathers of Independence."

The six men mentioned above were instrumental in paving the paths to freedom. They represented different walks of life, namely artist, diplomat, soldier, politician, and social activist. They held different political opinions, came from different social backgrounds, belonged to different religions, and had been born in different partitions. Despite these differences, they were able to unite in a common, imperative effort: INDEPENDENCE. Although they did not agree on everything, they were fully united and eagerly cooperated with each other. They remained faithful to their own opinions; however, building upon the existing momentum, they led Poland to FREEDOM.
