Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish where they are registered members.

From the Diocesan Office for the Protection of Children and Young People: A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the DRVC must first complete three requirements:

- Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- Sign the Codes of Conduct
- Complete a background screening application.
- 1. To fulfill the first step, you can sign up online to attend a Virtus (Protecting God's Children) class: **www.Virtus.org.** By logging on to the website, you will create a Virtus account.
- **2**. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**, which you should acknowledge. Once you register, you will be able to select a class that is convenient to you.
- **3.** The company providing the background screening is Sterling Volunteers. Complete the application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you do, you will be locked out of the process due to security protocol. You do need to provide your social Security number. If you do not provide it, you will be charged a fee.

All active volunteers require a background screening at five-year intervals. In order to facilitate this background screening, the Diocese has made the screening application available on the Virtus website. Those individuals who require a rescreening will receive an email with instructions to log into their Virtus account to complete the background screening application. Prompts will also be provided to electronically acknowledge the diocesan codes of conduct.
