## **BAPTISM:**

**The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.** Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). *(Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass


October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

The longer form of today's Gospel includes the familiar parable of the mustard seed. How wonderful that something so small and The Parable of the seemingly insignificant is

Mustard Seed used to illustrate such a remarkable truth! Indeed, this parable reveals a most valuable lesson that can be easily applied to our everyday lives.

Sometimes we avoid taking on tasks or responsibilities because they seem too large or difficult for us. We tell ourselves that we would like to be more generous with our time and talents, but our busy schedules don't afford us the hours or energy required. Take heart! This parable emphasizes that a small act of kindness, a word of encouragement, a nod of approval, or a simple smile can yield wondrous fruits. Reflect on the times that you were the recipient of a small gesture or a polite word. Such 'grace notes' in our lives are the things that deserve a fixed place in our memory bank. Think of the small or seemingly inconsequential kindnesses that have pointed to lifechanging events in your personal history. You will be pleasantly surprised and motivated to perform even tiny deeds of kindness that will be treasured by the receiver.





Today's psalm reminds us that the Lord is always ready to forgive. How comforting it is to know that His love is unconditional! We only need to present our

sincere contrition and firmly intend to sin no more. Have faith! After all, Saint Paul affirms that the "Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness."
