BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends. Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM (Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). *(Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

Pope Francis' December Prayer Intention: For Persons with Disabilities We pray that people living with disabilities may be at the center of attention in society, and that institutions may offer inclusive programs that value their active participation.

The idea that "to sing is to pray twice" is attribut-Christmas ed to Saint Augustine. Music Christmas music and holiday-themed movies have been available since November. If you have delayed listening to Christmas music until now, it is time to turn up the volume! One can easily derive peace and joy from listening to the beautiful hymns that honor the Advent season. Your careful listening can even become a prayer as your thoughts turn to God's gift of Jesus. The melodies are familiar and comforting. The lyrics are among the most lovely ones you know. Even a hardened heart would respond to "Sleep in heavenly peace." Say the words, savor the words... pray the words. Indulge yourself in a special moment that becomes a prayer experience...an experience of peace.
