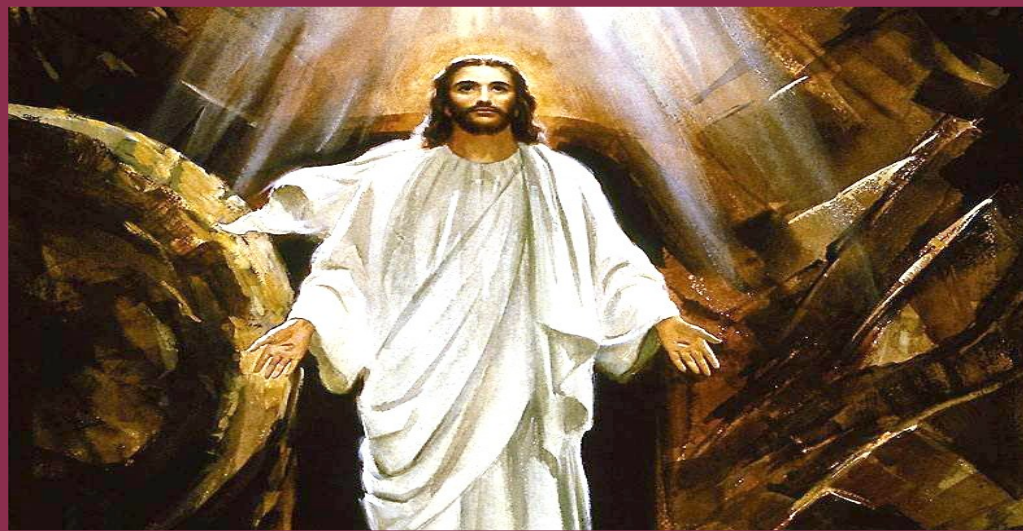

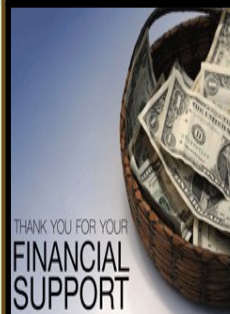

SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today, “is the day the LORD has made”: this is the expression of Psalm 118, 24 that we shall be singing throughout Easter time and fills out the celebration of our Christian faith. The Father has resurrected Jesus Christ, His beloved Son, in whom He delights, because He has loved to the point of giving his life for all of us.

Let us live this Easter with plenty of joy. Christ has risen: so let us celebrate it full of joy and love. Death, sin and sadness, have today been defeated by Jesus Christ... and He has opened the doors to a new life, the real life, the life we owe to the grace of the Holy Spirit. Nobody should be sad. Christ is our Peace and our Path forever and ever. Today, He “fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear” (Vatican Council II, Gaudium et Spes 22).

The great sign the Gospel gives us today is that Jesus' tomb is empty. We have to look no more among the dead for He who is alive has risen. And his disciples also realize his tomb is empty. They will see him risen later on; experiencing him alive in a wonderful meeting in faith. An empty tomb and apparitions will be the great signs for the believer's faith. The Gospel says: “Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed” (Jn 20:8). Through his faith he realizes that the emptiness, the burial cloths, and the cloth that had covered his head rolled up in a separate place, were all signs that God had been there, signs of the new life. Love can see signs where others cannot, and small signs are enough. “The other disciple whom Jesus loved” (Jn 20:2) was led by the love he had received from Christ.

The disciples “saw and believed”; this must also be our aim. Let us renew our paschal faith; that Christ be our Lord in everything we do. Let his Life revitalize ours and let us renew the grace of the baptism we have received; let us become his apostles and disciples; let us be guided by love and announce to all our happiness to believe in Christ; let us be hopeful witnesses of his Resurrection.

ROZWAŻANIE NA NIEDZIELE

Dzisiaj we wtorek piątego tygodnia Wielkiego Postu, w tygodniu kontemplacji Męki Pańskiej, On sam nas zaprasza byśmy się mu przypatrzyli z wyprzedzeniem jak na krzyżu dokonuje naszego odkupienia: «Jezus Chrystus jest naszym kapłanem, jego drogocenne ciało jest naszą ofiarą, którą złożył na drzewie krzyża dla zbawienia wszystkich ludzi» (św. Jan Fisher).

«Gdy wywyższycie Syna Człowieczego...» (J 8,28). W ten sposób, Chrystus Ukrzyżowany – Chrystus „wywyższony”! – jest wielkim i ostatecznym znakiem miłości Ojca do upadłej Ludzkości. Jego otwarte ramiona, rozciągnięte między niebem a ziemią, kreślą nieusuwalny znak jego przyjaźni z nami ludźmi. Widząc go tak, wywyższonego wobec naszego grzesznego spojrzenia, rozumiemy, że On JEST (J 8,28), i wtedy, podobnie jak słuchający go żydzi, także i my uwierzemy.

Tylko przyjaźń która jest oswojona z Krzyżem może dać nam zdolność do zagłębienia się w Sercu Odkupiciela. Wymagać Ewangelii bez krzyża, pozbawionej chrześcijańskiego rozumienia umartwienia, lub zanieczyszczoną pogańskimi lub naturalistycznymi naleciałościami, które uniemożliwiają zrozumienie wartości zbawczej cierpienia, może sprawić, iż usłyszymy z ust Chrystusa: «Przed wszystkim po cóż jeszcze do was mówię?».

Niech nasze spojrzenie na Krzyż, spojrzenie uspokajające i kontemplatywne, będzie pytaniem do Ukrzyżowanego, w którym bez hałasu słów spytamy go: «Kimże Ty jesteś?» (J 8,25). On nam odpowie, że jest «Drogą, Prawdą i Życiem» (J 14,6), krzewem winnym, w którym jeśli nie jesteśmy zaszczerpieni nie możemy dać owocu, gdyż tylko On ma słowa życia wiecznego. Dlatego, jeśli nie wierzymy, że On JEST, umrzemy w naszych grzechach. Będziemy żyli, bez wątplenia, i będziemy żyli już tu na ziemi życiem niebiańskim jeśli nauczymy się od Niego radosnego przekonania, że Ojciec jest z nami, i nie zostawia nas samych. W ten sposób będziemy naśladować Syna w wykonywaniu zawsze tego, co się podoba Ojcu.

COMUNIDAD HISPANO

REFLEXIONES DEL EVANGELIO

Hoy «es el día que hizo el Señor», iremos cantando a lo largo de toda la Pascua. Y es que esta expresión del Salmo 117 inunda la celebración de la fe cristiana. El Padre ha resucitado a su Hijo Jesucristo, el Amado, Aquél en quien se complace porque ha amado hasta dar su vida por todos.

Vivamos la Pascua con mucha alegría. Cristo ha resucitado: celebrémoslo llenos de alegría y de amor. Hoy, Jesucristo ha vencido a la muerte, al pecado, a la tristeza... y nos ha abierto las puertas de la nueva vida, la auténtica vida, la que el Espíritu Santo va dándonos por pura gracia. ¡Que nadie esté triste! Cristo es nuestra Paz y nuestro Camino para siempre. Él hoy «manifiesta plenamente el hombre al mismo hombre y le descubre su altísima vocación» (Concilio Vaticano II, Gaudium et Spes 22).

El gran signo que hoy nos da el Evangelio es que el sepulcro de Jesús está vacío. Ya no tenemos que buscar entre los muertos a Aquel que vive, porque ha resucitado. Y los discípulos, que después le verán Resucitado, es decir, lo experimentarán vivo en un encuentro de fe maravilloso, captan que hay un vacío en el lugar de su sepultura. Sepulcro vacío y apariciones serán las grandes señales para la fe del creyente. El Evangelio dice que «entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado el primero al sepulcro; vio y creyó» (Jn 20,8). Supo captar por la fe que aquel vacío y, a la vez, aquella sábana de amortajar y aquel sudario bien doblados eran pequeñas señales del paso de Dios, de la nueva vida. El amor sabe captar aquello que otros no captan, y tiene suficiente con pequeños signos. El «discípulo a quien Jesús quería» (Jn 20,2) se guiaba por el amor que había recibido de Cristo.

“Ver y creer” de los discípulos que han de ser también los nuestros. Renovemos nuestra fe pascual. Que Cristo sea en todo nuestro Señor. Dejemos que su Vida vivifique a la nuestra y renovemos la gracia del bautismo que hemos recibido. Hagámonos apóstoles y discípulos suyos. Guiémonos por el amor y anunciemos a todo el mundo la felicidad de creer en Jesucristo. Seamos testigos esperanzados de su Resurrección.

Most Reverend John O. Barres

***Statement on the Death of the
Most Reverend William F. Murphy,
Bishop Emeritus of Rockville Centre***

Thursday, March 26, 2026



Bishop William Murphy came to Long Island in 2001 as the fourth Bishop of Rockville Centre. During more than fifteen years of episcopal ministry, he led the diocese with an evangelizing and reforming spirit, offering a joyful witness of prayer, preaching, and pastoral leadership.

Formed for the priesthood in Rome, Bishop Murphy had a deep love for the Eternal City and the universal Church. During the pontificates of Pope Saint Paul VI and Pope Saint John Paul II, he served the Holy See as an official of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace and later was a driving force behind the *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church*, which remains an important and enduring reference.

Bishop Murphy was widely respected for his expertise in Vatican diplomacy and international relations and was deeply committed to ecumenical and interfaith dialogue. With a gift for friendship, he generously mentored many priests and bishops and championed the apostolate of the laity and their vital role in the public square.

His faithful service leaves a lasting legacy on Long Island and throughout the universal Church.

As we pray for the repose of Bishop Murphy's soul, we give thanks for his devoted episcopal ministry and enduring witness of faith. May he rest in the peace of Christ.
