Prayer ... and almsgiving

Lent offers children a wonderful opportunity to learn about almsgiving. If you set up a Lenten space as suggested

last week, think of adding a small bowl to the table. Adults can empty their loose change at the end of each day. Children can add a portion of their allowances or give up the money that would have gone toward a treat. When the bowl is full, have the children accompany you to the grocery store and select items to donate to a local food pantry. What a wonderful way to introduce sacrifice and charity to young stewards of the faith!



Especially during Lent, we are minded that we are *One Family in Mission* and thus are 'Called to Evangelize.' For many of us, we

publicly display our belief that our faith is a gift from God. Some of us may wear a cross or religious medal around our necks; others may give witness when receiving ashes on their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. These are great things to do because they serve to open the door of faith to those around us; we are witnesses! As witnesses, do we have unwavering faith? When times get tough, do we put our faith in God as Abraham did? When finances, work, or school loom over us, do we give in to fear and anxiety? Rather, do we, like Abraham, place our trust in a living God?

No one ever said that life would be easy; in fact, most have said the opposite. Jesus, however, offers us hope. He tells us to come to Him and to take His yoke upon ourselves.

Today we also celebrate the feast of Saint Patrick, a man who, despite living in a hostile and dangerous

environment, accepted suffering and success with equal measure. By placing his faith in God, Patrick was able to live out his missionary call to evangelize Ireland. In so doing, he exemplified his formation as a disciple. As God guides us through life's problems, allow God to form you, as He formed Patrick, into His disciple. He will if you let Him.
