






Second reading

The Saints....Seekers of Holiness

This week we celebrate one of the most wellknown saints of the Catholic Church: Saint **Thomas Aguinas**, the noted philosopher and theologian who lived in the medieval period (13th century). Saint Thomas Aquinas was a preeminent teacher of the Catholic Church and therefore earned the title of 'Doctor of the Church.' He is known for his writings, particularly for his magnum opus, the Summa Theologica. He believed in divine revelation but also recognized reason as one of God's great gifts.; he was able to see a harmony between reason and faith. Saint Thomas Aguinas was a champion of learning and understanding. It is no wonder that Saint Thomas Aquinas is the patron saint of students and of all schools and universities.
