

Today we light the fourth candle on the Advent wreath. This candle is the Candle of Love. Jesus is the source of all love.





*Saint Stephen, Feast Day: December 26*

In the earliest days of the Church, Stephen was chosen as one of its first deacons. The apostles chose deacons to help in pastoral ministries so that they could spend more time teaching. Because of his preaching and miracles, Stephen found much favor with people. Unfortunately, his popularity prompted anger from the persecutors of the early Church. They accused Stephen of being a blasphemer who spoke against God and Moses. Stephen was brought to trial, an unfair trial that included false witnesses to testify against him. Stephen defended himself. At the conclusion of his defense, Stephen saw a vision of Jesus at God's right hand. This beautiful vision was misinterpreted by his accusers as proof of his blasphemy. Before Stephen was stoned to death, he spoke the following words, words that reflect his love for the Lord and remind us of the Lord's own last words. "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit. Lord, do not hold this sin against them. " Stephen became the first martyr. He is now known as the patron saint of altar servers, brick layers, casket makers, and stone masons. (It is interesting to note that present at the trial and execution was a man named Saul of Tarsus. We know of the conversion of this persecutor, who later on encountered the Lord and eventually became St. Paul, the Apostle.
